Reading Romans (9:1-11:36)

 Paul's central focus has been on whether or not God has been <u>FAITHFUL</u> to His promise(s) made to Abraham (on behalf of all humanity).

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The <u>TORAH</u> (Rom. 7,8).
 Ethnic/national <u>ISRAEL</u> (9-11).

– Here (Rom. 9-11), Paul will restate His major argument ("just. by FAITH") in specfic connection to ethnic Israel and her having been "chosen" (in some sense) as the people of God.

- It isn't difficult to read the NT (or OT, too) and get the rub that the Jews (generally) looked down their noses at the Gentiles (cf. Rom. 2:17ff.); much of the smugness came from the fact that God CHOSE (elected) Israel in a sense!

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 NOT because Israel was <u>EXCEPTIONAL</u> (cf. Deut. 7:6-11; 9:4-6).

 But, this "choosing" (electing) of/ from God was . . .

2a) NOT a comment on all Jews' status of <u>SALVATION</u> – God chose the nation (as a whole) – He had to choose someone!

 But, this "choosing" (electing) of/ from God was . . .

2b) God chose the nation for a <u>TASK/PURPOSE</u> (cf. 9:5,11)! (similarly, He chose Isaac, Jacob . . . even Pharaoh!)

- Specifically, God chose Israel for the specific task/purpose of bringing the MESSIAH (cf. Rom. 9:3-5), the source of blessing for the world – after all, some nation/ people had to be chosen for this (at the expense of the rest).

 Israel's biggest problem, in relation to God's choosing/using her, was that she approached things without <u>FAITH</u> (cf. Rom. 9:6-8, 30-32).

* "Faith" needs defined (later).

- Israel was seeking "righteousness" ("faithfulness") but doing such through an incorrect APPROACH (9:30-32) – this is NOT altogether different from today's people's seeking "salvation" (a noble desire!) . . .

- They sought such . . .

1) without appropriate <u>KNOWLEDGE</u> (10:2,3 [w/17])!

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- They sought such . . .

2) by seeking to establish their <u>OWN</u> method (10:3)!
3) without <u>SUBMITTING</u>/ subjecting one's self to God (10:3)

 If Israel had pursued her noble desire with the right approach, she would've ended up at her <u>MESSIAH</u> (cf. 9:30-32; 10:4)!

 Liking it or not, Israel actually still brought the Christ/Messiah, fulfilling the big task that God chose/elected her for . . .

* See Acts 13:27?!

- This showed . . .

 Salvation, even in Moses' day, was always/actually "by <u>FAITH</u>" (cf. Rom. 10:5-13, using Deut. 30:11-14)!

- This showed . . .

2) Salvation, now, was to be taken directly to <u>GENTILES</u> (cf. Rom. 10:5-21).

 This whole platform would serve a <u>DUAL</u> purpose, saving Gentiles and also provoking the faithless Israelites/Jews, so . . .

* Now, Romans 11 . . .

- Paul has openly insisted that "being a physical Israelite" doesn't comment on one's status of salvation with God (cf. 9:6-8) it's no shock that he feels like ELIJAH (cf. Rom. 11:1-4), alone and depressed!

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 Paul is a physical <u>JEW</u> – he doesn't condemn himself, so, he actually extends hope for physical Jews (on another basis)!

 But, Paul's controversial message needs some nuancing . . .

2) Paul is NOT being "anti-Semitic" – He's actually being <u>PRO</u>-Semitic (in the realest sense [cf. Rom. 9:1-3; 10:1])!

- Using the illustration of "grafting trees/branches," Paul insists that neither Jews nor Gentiles are "in" on the basis of "nationality" or "ethnicity" but are both given opportunity by <u>FAITH</u> in <u>MESSIAH</u> (cf. 11:20,23)!

 And, that, "faith" (all that's packed into this shorthand/catchword for Paul) is "how" even "all (physical) Israel" can be <u>SAVED</u> (cf. 11:26 w/10:4)!

– Here's what we've learned . . .

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 God's "choosing" or "electing" (in this context) has been for TASK/PURPOSE – His "using" physical Israel to bring Christ says nothing of their salvation.

- Here's what we've learned . . .

2) Salvation has ALWAYS been on the BASIS of FAITH.

- Here's what we've learned . . .

3) Preaching an exclusive salvation in Jesus as the Jewish Messiah is NOT anti-Semitic but pro-Semitic – they're invited in (by faith), too!

<u>Conclusions . .</u>

- Hear (Rom. 10:17) – Believe (Rom. 10:9,10) - Repent (Rom. 2:4,5) - Confess (Rom. 10:9,10) – Be Baptized (Rom. 6:1-7) - Live Faithfully (Rom. 2:13)
